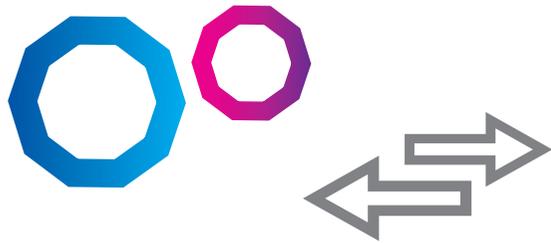

Introduction

What is this resource?

This **Unit Mapping** resource is one of five sections that complete the *Recognition of Prior Learning Assessment Toolkit for HLT51612 Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled-Division 2 nursing)* - called the *RPL Toolkit*.

The **Assessor Guide** provides further information on the RPL approach and advice on how each section of the *RPL Toolkit* is used.

This resource provides detailed mapping of the Essential Knowledge and Skills in the *RPL Toolkit* to the requirements of units of competency from the *HLT51612 Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled-Division 2 nursing)*.

Essential Knowledge and Skills listed in the HLT51612 Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled-Division 2 nursing) have been collated and clustered into similar skills or knowledge sets. Some of the wording from the training package has been altered however the content has been encapsulated for those statements not quoted exactly from the training package.

The tables provide a visual representation of each clustered knowledge or skill set and those core units of competency the knowledge and skill sets are embedded within.

Please refer to range statements for the relevant unit of competency to provide context.

This document is intended as a guide to Assessors in developing holistic assessment or gap training approaches. It is not developed for use by applicants as part of the RPL process.

The key audience is the Assessor; however, it could also be of interest to personnel responsible for quality assurance and compliance in the Registered Training Organisation (RTO).

How should Assessors use this resource?

Assessors may need to consider the mapping in this resource when determining the assessment methods they use for each cluster of units for a student, or in validating assessment. In addition, if a student already holds a unit in a cluster, Assessors may consult the mapping in determining assessment methods for single units.

Assessors may contextualise the *RPL Toolkit* to suit the needs of students, employers or enterprises, or to meet RTO's policies. **However, co-badging with an RTO's logo is not permitted.**

- 1.3 Principles of therapeutic alliance
- 1.4 Strategies to support mediation/negotiation/resolution of conflict
- 1.5 Counselling resources within environment and community
- 1.6 Recognising triggers for challenging behaviours
- 1.7 Limitations to effective written communication and strategies to overcome
- 1.8 Principles/ legal implications of documentation requirements including:
 - Mandatory reporting requirements
 - Legal compliance for recording and reporting
 - Abbreviations for health terms
 - Incident reporting
 - Medication administration
- 1.9 Models of documentation for recording client focused/nursing oriented action, data collection instruments (including electronic systems) used in health care environments

3. Trans-cultural approaches to nursing

Understanding of the principles and practices to support trans-cultural nursing including:

- 3.1 Understand the phenomenon of culture, and cultural diversity including:
 - Its impact on communities in Australian society
 - Including the diversity between cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples
- 3.2 Health and illness issues facing people from countries other than Australia
- 3.3 Health issues for ATSI peoples including factors that contribute to ill health and disease and the impact for health care delivery (impact of European settlement)
- 3.4 Identification of health themes that impact on health and/or illness (ability, disability, emotional issues, religion, language, impact of racism and discrimination, culture, community)
- 3.5 Cultural, spiritual and religious considerations for nursing approaches which reflect respectful practices including:
 - Inclusiveness
 - Acknowledgement of own and others beliefs and practices that influence behaviour and health status
 - Awareness of traditional medicines for ATSI peoples
- 3.6 Impact of culture and belief systems on mental health and illness
- 3.7 Knowledge of available resources and assistance to assist with issues related to cultural diversity

4. Anatomy and physiology/patho-physiology/health terminology

Knowledge of anatomy and physiology theory/patho-physiology of disease/health terminology including:

4.1 In depth understanding of concepts of anatomy and physiology including:

- Interpretation of relevant terminology associated with anatomy and physiology
- Mechanisms to support life requirements for survival, basic chemistry, transport mechanisms, cellular respiration, homeostatic responses,
- Structure and function of cell and tissue types and organs
- All major body systems: gastro intestinal, nervous, special senses, endocrine, urinary, reproductive, fluid/electrolyte balance and musculo skeletal, cardiovascular, respiratory, integumentary, lymphatic

4.2 Understand concepts of patho-physiology including:

- Interpretation of relevant terminology associated with patho-physiology
- Factors contributing to disease development (genetic, nutrition, trauma, degenerative change)
- Patho-physiology of disease associated with each body system: gastro intestinal, nervous, special senses, endocrine, urinary, reproductive, biochemical, fluid/electrolyte balance and musculo skeletal, cardiovascular, respiratory, integumentary, lymphatic

4.3 Terminology related to specialisation areas such as mental health, restorative/rehabilitation care, wound management, surgery/surgical procedures, oncology

4.4 Principles of acute and medical nursing terminology including:

- Recognised terms and abbreviations for nursing interventions associated with care of clients
- Approved medication terminology
- Knowledge of correct spelling of terms

4.5 Lifespan approach to anatomy and physiology and the influences of genetics and environment on human growth and development, including the physiology of ageing

5. Infection control principles

Knowledge of microbiology and infection control practices:

5.1 Understand principles of infection control including compliance with current infection control practices and guidelines such as:

- Effective hand washing (routine/surgical) and personal standards of hygiene
- Clean and sterile technique
- Guidelines for use of Personal Protective Equipment (gown, apron, mask, eye wear, glove use)
- Management of sharps
- Immunisation requirements
- Infection control risk assessment and identification
- Cleaning, routine, managing body fluid spills

5.2 Modes of transmission of infection and disease, and factors influencing transmission including:

- Source, carrier and incubation phases
- Host immunological state and susceptibility
- Risk of acquisition

5.3 Knowledge of basic microbiology related to pathogens:

- Bacteria, spores, anaerobic organisms, Gram positive and Gram negative organisms, fungi, virus
- Nosocomial infection

5.4 Methods of identifying bacteria and common bacterial diseases

6. Support the planning and delivery of health care

Achieve identified outcomes of care appropriate to client's health status in line with principles and concepts underpinning specific approaches, philosophies and regimes of nursing practice and health care. Includes:

- 6.1 Understand organisational protocols and policies related to own area of work:
 - No lift policy guidelines to ensure safe practice
 - Risk assessment in critical, non-critical clinical situations and in the mental health context
 - The impact of stigma and discrimination on clients and consumers of services including aged, or Indigenous peoples, or who have mental health issues
- 6.2 Knowledge of personnel associated with health service delivery including:
 - Group dynamics
 - Function of a MDT and role of each health care team members
- 6.3 Professional issues related to nursing role, including:
 - Historical and current perspectives of the nursing profession
 - Knowledge of nursing theorists and their work
 - Critical thinking, reflective practice, problem solving process and evidence based practice
 - Quality improvement programs and accreditation standards
 - Understanding of the role and function of professional and industrial bodies relevant to enrolled nurse practice
 - Performance appraisal processes and practices
 - Educational, career opportunities for enrolled nurses
 - Processes for employment for enrolled nurses
 - Age and gender issues
- 6.4 Application of nursing theory in developing plan of care for the client, use of best practice guidelines to address complex and/or special and/or mental health needs
- 6.5 Patterns of nursing care (functional, team, client assignment, primary nursing)
- 6.6 Understanding of how health and illness factors for clients impact on nursing practice

7. Legal and ethical frameworks for nursing practice

Have knowledge of legislation and codes of practice that relate to an enrolled nurse, including:

7.1 Statutory framework within which nursing takes place and legal requirements for standards of practice including:

- Principles related to administration of medication by an enrolled nurse, practices and routes of administration
- Legislation related to mental illness including Mental Health Act – ‘Authorised person’

7.2 Legal frameworks/requirements including:

- Codes of practice
- ACFI documentation, Aged Care Act
- Workplace Health and Safety legislation:
 - Sources of WHS information within and external to workplace
 - Examples of hazards of work environment
 - Principles of hazard ID and risk assessment (workplace inspection, reporting requirements, examples of hazard alert mechanisms)
 - Hierarchy of control

- 1.12 Sharing information as oral/written presentation

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3. Trans-cultural approaches to nursing

Ability to use cultural safety approaches:

- 3.1 Form mutual mentoring arrangements with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people
- 3.2 Demonstrate sensitivity and respectfully communicate in a cross-cultural context
- 3.3 Form effective relationships with persons from another culture
- 3.4 Reflect on actions and events to make and maintain cross-cultural relationships
- 3.5 Advocate for anti racism/discrimination
- 3.6 Reflect on self and make changes to practice in a cross-cultural context
- 3.7 Participate in identifying and implementing culturally safe work practices

Essential Skills - 3. Trans-cultural approaches to nursing

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4. Anatomy and physiology/patho-physiology/health terminology

Ability to accurately articulate concepts of anatomy and physiology, and patho-physiology using correct health terminology. In detail describe and explain:

4.1 Principles of functional anatomy of body systems including:

- Major components of each system, structure and their location
- Inter-relationships of body structures and systems

4.2 The relationship of each body system using concepts and principles specific to the nature of particular health care to be provided

4.3 Key factors necessary to healthy functioning of each body system, and inter-relationships between body systems needed to maintain overall health

4.4 Identify variations from normal functioning and potential interactions between body systems and other internal and external factors

4.5 Explain common issues and associated patho-physiology for each body system and its components, using terms relevant to specific health care to be provided

4.6 Recognise variations from normal functioning and determine an appropriate response in terms of:

- Referral to an appropriate medical, nursing or allied health professional
- Provision of appropriate health care services
- Report and record clinical information

4.7 Associated health issues in the context of health care provision and services specific to the nature of the care required

Essential Skills - 4. Anatomy and physiology/patho-physiology/health terminology

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5. Infection control principles

Ability to apply infection control principles in a variety of health environments:

5.1 Apply standard precautions including:

- Procedures for washing and drying hands
- Use of Personal Protective Equipment

5.2 Practice clean and sterile/aseptic techniques including:

- Medication handling
- Ensuring instruments used for invasive procedures are sterile at time of use (where appropriate)
- Limit contamination
- Maintain clean surfaces and manage blood and body fluid spills

5.3 Protect materials, equipment and instruments from contamination until required for use

5.4 Apply additional precautions when standard precautions are not sufficient

5.5 Undertake infection control risk assessment in relation to:

- Self
- Client
- Others

Essential Skills - 5. Infection control principles

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6. Support the planning and delivery of health care

Achieve identified outcomes of care appropriate to clients health status in line with principles and concepts underpinning specific approaches, philosophies and regimes of nursing practice and health care. Includes:

- 6.1 Holistic client assessment, which recognises and addresses the special needs of clients
- 6.2 Support rights of clients and their family
- 6.3 Comply with relevant guidelines and procedures and demonstrate ethical practice
- 6.4 Meeting duty of care responsibilities including:
 - Checking the workplace for hazards and implementing hazard control
 - Undertaking risk assessment
- 6.5 Apply problem-solving skills:
 - Including use of tools and techniques to solve problems
 - Analyse information and make decisions that require discretion and confidentiality
- 6.6 Applying effective time management skills to achieve objectives within agreed timeframes, by prioritising workload and managing contingencies
- 6.7 Participate as a member of a health care team
- 6.8 Apply information technology skills
- 6.9 Promote the work of the organisation
- 6.10 Provide mentoring in line with jurisdictional regulatory requirements
- 6.11 Professional self review by regular evaluation of actions through process of critical thinking, analysis and reflection, and plan development of skills

- Improvements or deterioration in signs/symptoms

- Risk assessment

8.3 Apply health care procedures:

- Admission and discharge procedures
- Pre procedural/pre-operative care
- Post procedural/post-operative care

8.4 Support mobility function:

- Manual handling/risk assessment
- Assist with mobility
- Positioning/active and passive exercises
- Use of wheelchairs and walking aids
- Application of prosthesis
- Range of active and passive exercises

8.5 Support hygiene and grooming:

- Hygiene (bathing and showering)
- Eye toilet, nasal toilet, perineal toilet
- Oral hygiene
- Dressing and undressing
- Baths and wet packs

8.6 Support integument function:

- Maintaining skin integrity
- Care to prevent pressure and decubitus ulcers
- Wound assessment
- Implement wound care principles - asepsis, that promote healing
- Wound management techniques - wound cleansing, debridement, packing a wound
- Removal of staples and sutures

8.7 Support cardiovascular function:

- Blood transfusion care
- Recording of 12 lead electrocardiogram

8.8 Support respiratory function:

- Administration of oxygen therapy
- Established tracheostomy care
- Use of nebulisers/inhalers

8.9 Support nutrition and hydration:

- Insertion/care of a nasogastric tube
- Administer nasogastric feed
- Administer gastrostomy feed
- Assistance with eating/feeding
- Fluid intake needs/assistance with drinking

8.10 Support elimination functions:

- Assist clients with continence problems
- Observations of client undergoing peritoneal or haemodialysis
- Stoma care
- Insertion of indwelling catheter, care of indwelling catheters

8.11 Support comfort and rest:

- Assist clients with chronic pain
- Rest and sleep/bed making
- Promote comfort

8.12 Support neurological function:

- Assist with electro-convulsant therapy

8.13 Support immunological function:

- Isolation and barrier nursing

8.14 Support endocrine function:

- Assist clients with hypoglycaemia

8.15 Basic life support and emergency care

8.16 Explain and demonstrate emergency management for client experiencing adverse medication reaction

8.17 Monitor intravenous therapy

8.18 Rehabilitation and restorative care

9. Management of health care needs across the lifespan

Respond to variations in health care needs across the lifespan:

9.1 Modification of assessment and intervention techniques to accommodate lifespan needs:

- Developmental age/stage of development
- Self esteem
- Body image
- Consent
- Lifestyle choices
- Use of equipment for nursing skills or data collection

9.2 Perspectives of mental health, mental health problems and mental illness across the lifespan including:

- Undertaking specific observations of mental health status including close/constant observations
- Prevention and management of aggression including level of risk, signs of physical injury/distress
- Assessment of levels of personal distress and anxiety

- Observe client/carers spiritual, cultural needs, lifespan, developmental needs
- Recognise and respond to behaviours correlated to grief and bereavement
- Identify resources to assist client/carers with the living dying phases of illness
- Respond to death in the health care setting

9.4 Promote and support community development for ATSI people and communities by participating in developing and implementing strategies for sharing power and facilitating participation, self determination and self control
